

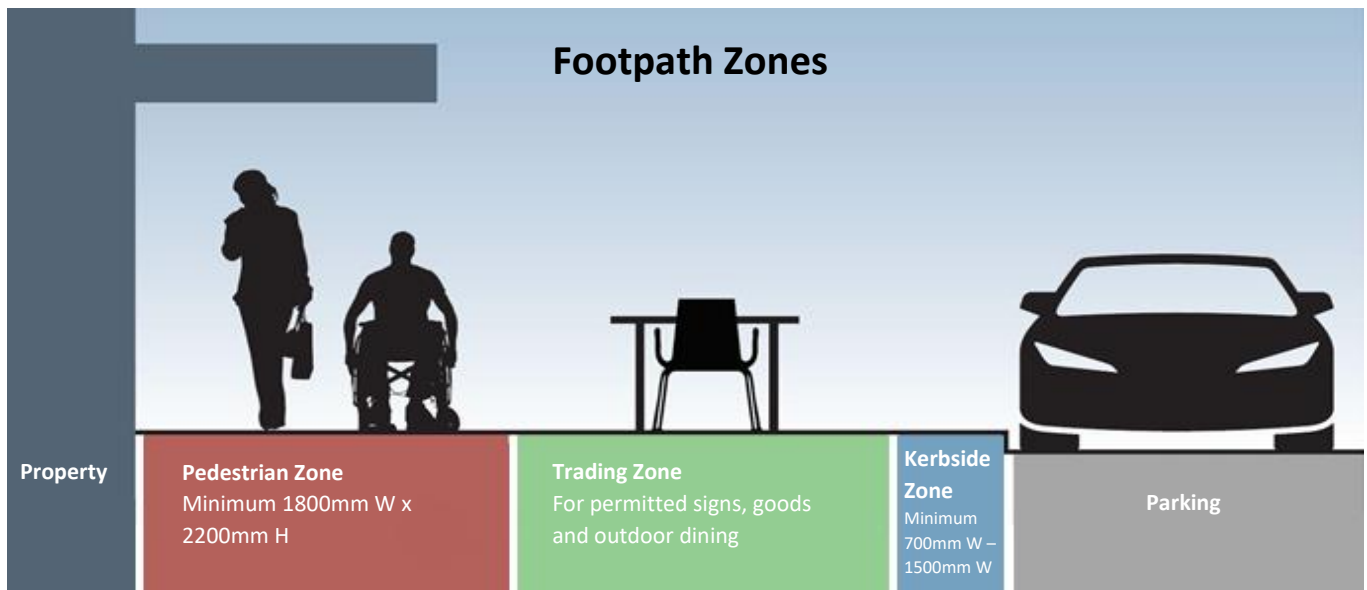
Footpath Trading



Whilst the primary purpose of footpaths is to provide safe pedestrian **access for all**¹, under certain **conditions**² Council may allow businesses to use part of the footpath 'Trading Zone' to display goods, place their advertising signs and outdoor dining facilities.

For safe and attractive Footpath Trading activities, the footpath is divided into three zones:

- **Pedestrian Zone:** clear and accessible path of travel, from the property line of the business towards the kerb for a minimum of 1800mm wide and 2200mm high.
- **Trading Zone:** for permitted signs, goods and outdoor dining.
- **Kerbside Zone:** buffer from the kerb towards the property line of the business for a minimum of 700mm wide, or 1500mm wide if adjacent to an accessible (disabled) parking bay or loading zone.
